

SEMESTER/YEAR NON-EMORY STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM PETITION

Center for International Programs Abroad, Emory University

DEADLINES: March 1 for Fall programs and October 1 for Spring programs

1. **PREREQUISITES:** Most programs have preconditions for approval, so students must meet or plan to meet the specified prerequisites for the program they want to attend. In addition, CIPA requires that all petitioners for Non-Emory programs:
 - A. Have and maintain at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA.
 - B. Be in good academic standing.
 - C. Enroll full-time at Emory the semester prior to their study abroad program.
 - D. Meet the minimum language requirement (if any) as specified in the program description.
 - E. Have completed at least 3 semesters (48 semester hours or equivalent) of college level work.

WAIVER: If you do not meet the above criteria, you can petition for a waiver by:

 - A. Obtaining two letters from faculty members supporting your request for a waiver; the letter from your Academic Advisor (see below) can count as one of the letters.
 - B. Addressing your request for a waiver in your application essay – give specific reasons that support your application to study abroad despite not meeting the specified pre-requisite, such as GPA requirement.

2. **PETITION:** If you plan to attend a Non-Emory study abroad program, you must submit a petition to CIPA to receive approval to transfer credit. Your petition must demonstrate a **compelling academic reason** for studying on a Non-Emory program. Your petition will be evaluated by the ICIS Review Committee on 1) the appropriateness of your plan of study to your overall academic plan, 2) the quality of the match between your goals and the opportunities that the program offers, 3) the strength of your preparation at Emory, 4) the academic rigor and quality of the program, 5) the level of cultural immersion or integration in the host country, and 6) academic justification for not studying on an Emory program. **TO COMPLETE THE PETITION PROCESS, PLEASE SUBMIT THE FOLLOWING TO CIPA BY THE STATED DEADLINE:**
 - CIPA NON-EMORY PROGRAM PETITION FORM**
 - A. Parts 1, 2, 3, and 4 – including ALL required signatures – **SUBMIT ORIGINAL + 4 COPIES**
 - B. Realization of Danger & Release Statement
 - C. Transfer of Credit form – **SUBMIT ORIGINAL + 4 COPIES**
 - D. Consent for Release of Information & Emergency Contact Information
 - E. Study Abroad Health / Emergency Information

 - LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION FROM YOUR ACADEMIC ADVISOR:** Your Academic Advisor should indicate that he/she has read and supports your petition to study abroad on a non-Emory program. Please arrange to pick up the letter in a sealed envelope and submit it with the rest of your petition.

 - NON-EMORY PETITION QUESTIONNAIRE – SUBMIT ORIGINAL + 4 COPIES**
 The ICIS Review Committee will carefully review your answers to these questions, so this is your opportunity to make your case to study abroad on a Non-Emory program. Please attach a separate, typed sheet (or sheets) addressing each of the following questions:
 1. What do you hope to achieve by studying abroad on this particular program?
 2. What are your compelling academic reasons which cannot be met by studying on an Emory program?
 3. What coursework or other academic experiences have prepared you to participate in this particular program?
 4. How will your experience on this program enhance your academic and/or career goals?
 5. Other comments, additional information in support of your petition.

 - TRANSCRIPT:** Include an unofficial copy of your Emory transcript printed off OPUS–**SUBMIT ORIGINAL+ 4 COPIES**

 - PROGRAM INFORMATION – SUBMIT ORIGINAL + 4 COPIES:** To provide the CIPA office and the ICIS Review Committee with information about your chosen study abroad program, please submit a brochure or a print-out of the homepage of the program's website.

 - \$300 DEPOSIT:** The \$300 deposit is required to process your petition. (The check should be made payable to "Emory University.") The deposit will be applied to the \$800 Processing Fee if you are approved to participate on a Non-Emory semester program. **REFUND POLICY:** The processing fee is non-refundable unless your petition is rejected or you are not accepted to your study abroad program.

 - PASSPORT PHOTOCOPY:** Submit a photocopy of the inside page of your passport. If you do not have a valid passport (or if your passport will expire within six months of the end date of your program), you should apply for one immediately and bring a copy to CIPA when you receive it.

3. **FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIPS:** Students attending Non-Emory programs are not eligible to use Emory financial aid and grants for study abroad. In some cases, federal and state financial aid may be applied to the study abroad program, pending approval of the Financial Aid Office.
4. **NOTIFICATION:** The ICIS Review Committee will review your petition after the March 1 or October 1 deadline. If your petition is successful, you will be notified of your provisional approval within a month of the deadline. If your petition is not approved, you have the opportunity to appeal through the College's Committee on Academic Standards. Please refer to the website <http://college.emory.edu/students/cas.html> for instructions.
5. **BEFORE LEAVING:**
- PROGRAM NOTIFICATION:** You will receive an official approval letter from CIPA once you submit a copy of your official acceptance letter from the Non-Emory program. If you decide to withdraw from the program, you must submit a letter of withdrawal to CIPA.
 - PRE-DEPARTURE ORIENTATION:** You are REQUIRED to attend the CIPA orientation session. Failure to attend may result in you missing essential information. Failure to complete and return any required forms will prevent the final processing of your application materials.
 - TRANSFER OF CREDIT:** Approval to study abroad on a Non-Emory program does not guarantee that the courses will transfer. Credit must still be evaluated according to University policies. For all courses you intend to take abroad, you must consult the appropriate department at Emory PRIOR to your study abroad period and have the approvals in writing on the Approval of Transfer Credit form included in this petition. If CIPA does not have a signed copy of your transfer of credit form prior to your departure, you risk not receiving credit.

Students are allowed to transfer a maximum of 16 semester hours of credit per semester of work done on a Non-Emory study abroad program. Emory will evaluate the credit that you earn on study abroad programs in accordance with the policies that govern the transfer of credit (Emory College Bulletin).

- Courses must be taken for a letter grade.
- Courses must be of high quality and have a workload similar to a course at Emory.
- Courses must be academic liberal arts courses of the kind that are offered by Emory College (i.e. NO engineering, fashion, food courses, orientation courses, etc.).
- You cannot duplicate work already completed at Emory.
- A grade of "C" (2.0) or higher must be earned; credit that bears a "C-" or lower will not transfer.
- Credit transfers in hours, not in courses. Therefore, a three-unit course taken abroad will receive three units of transfer credit.
- Internships do not receive academic credit unless you have written pre-approval from an Emory faculty member who will supervise your work and have been approved through CIPA for internship credit.

CIPA will review all transcripts and make a recommendation to the Registrar regarding the amount of credit that should be applied to your degree. CIPA may require more detailed information about the specific courses taken and will often consult appropriate departments at Emory as well as the study abroad program to determine the appropriate transfer of credit. You should be prepared to answer questions about the courses and the work that you have done and to produce course syllabi, materials, and assignments if required.

Credits for Non-Emory study abroad programs will be awarded as "transfer" credit only and will appear at the top of your Emory transcript – grades will not be included in the Emory cumulative GPA. The titles from the overseas courses will appear in this section along with assigned equivalents.

6. **WHILE ABROAD:**
- COURSE LOAD:** You are expected to maintain a standard full load of classes (as defined by the host institution); this will typically be equivalent to 15-16 credits at Emory.
 - PRE-REGISTRATION:** You will be notified by CIPA regarding pre-registration details for the following semester. You are responsible for pre-registering on OPUS while overseas.
7. **AFTER TERM ABROAD:**
- OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT:** You are responsible for requesting that an official transcript be sent from the overseas institution after your term abroad is complete. The transcript should be sent to the following address:

Transcripts delivered by students will not be accepted. The transcript is only considered "official" if it comes to CIPA directly from the institution abroad.

Emory will award "transfer" credit only for the coursework taken abroad and only according to the policies that govern the transfer of credit to Emory College: courses must be of high quality, have a workload similar to a course at Emory, and be academic liberal arts courses of the kind offered by Emory College (i.e. NO engineering, fashion, food, orientation courses, etc.; I cannot duplicate work already completed at Emory; credit transfers in hours, not courses. This transfer of credit requires that CIPA receive an official transcript from an accredited academic institution, that courses must be taken for a letter grade, and that the grades earned must be "C" or above.

CENTER FOR INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS ABROAD STUDY ABROAD HEALTH / EMERGENCY INFORMATION

Every Emory College study abroad participant must *read, sign, and return this form* indicating they understand health issues that may relate to their participation on a study abroad program.

I. Medical Conditions

Emory College recommends that all students get a thorough physical examination before participating in study abroad. Discuss with your physician your intent to study abroad and get advice for managing your physical and emotional health while in another country. Describe your health condition (allergies, disabilities, psychological treatment, dietary requirements, and medical needs) with your physician, and seriously consider the appropriateness of your participation in study abroad in your chosen host country.

Actions:

1. If you have any medical or psychological condition that may require attention while you are abroad, discuss this with your physician before going abroad.
2. Ask your physician if your medication will be readily accessible in your host country.
3. Take necessary medications (in original, labeled containers) and written prescriptions with you.
4. It is advisable that you carry a letter from your doctor explaining the use of your medication so it is not suspected as contraband.
5. Get necessary immunizations well in advance of your departure.

II. Medical Facilities/Services

Medical facilities and services will not be the same in every country. It is important to understand as much as possible about the facilities and services in your host country before you should need them.

Actions:

1. Be sure you get information in your program-specific orientation about medical facilities and services in your host city/country.
2. You will need to understand where to go for common health needs (i.e., cold, stomach ache, flu, etc.) and where to go for emergencies.
3. You will need to know how medical services are paid for (i.e., out-of-pocket by the student, host country or institution, insurance, etc.).
4. Understand your insurance coverage before going abroad (does your insurance cover you in another country, what is covered, what is not, how to make claims, etc.).
5. You will need to know who to contact in case of a medical emergency.

III. Disabilities

Students requiring accommodations for a medical condition and/or disability during a study abroad program experience must submit an accommodation letter from the Office of Disability Services (ODS) to CIPA and/or the host country Program Director before going abroad. The earlier the request is made, the more measures CIPA can take to discuss accommodations in the host country. **Please note:** "reasonable accommodations" provided on the Emory campus may differ and/or may not be available in the host country.

Actions:

1. Submit the Study Abroad Self Identification form included in your orientation packet to ODS. Please note: If you have not already registered with Emory's Office of Disability Services, contact an ODS representative at 404-727-6016 (V) or 404-712-2049 (TTY).
2. Schedule an appointment with ODS to discuss services available in your chosen host country. ODS will provide CIPA with an accommodation letter specifically for the study abroad experience.
3. After review, CIPA will notify you about the availability of your requested accommodations. If the requested accommodations are not available in the chosen host country and/or institution, a CIPA representative, in consultation with ODS, will discuss your options with you.

IV. Mental Health

Not all countries have mental health support services similar to what we are accustomed to in the U.S. Thus, students may not have access to mental health services in some countries. Whether students have utilized mental health services in the past or not, it is important for students to know if, what, and where those services are available in their host country.

Actions:

1. All students should be prepared for cultural adjustment before studying abroad. CIPA has a list of recommended readings which will inform students about the cycle of adjustment to a different culture. Although this information will not prevent students from experiencing cultural adjustment problems, it will prepare them for the symptoms, the expected cycle, and some helpful advice for a successful adjustment.
2. Students who are currently, or have utilized mental health services in the past, should contact the Emory Counseling Center before going abroad. The Emory Counseling Center should be advised as to your needs so they can help you develop a health care plan while abroad.
3. Students who are currently involved with mental health services should seriously discuss the advisability of participating in study abroad and issues related to cultural adjustment with their mental health practitioner.

V. Emergency Protocol

The majority of students participating in study abroad never experience an emergency while abroad. However, any emergency is less traumatic when you are prepared to deal with it effectively and efficiently. It will make you feel more comfortable if you take the time to prepare an emergency protocol when you arrive at your host location.

Actions:

1. Carry some form of identification with you at all times (your name, your host country address, host country phone #, copy of passport and visa).
2. Carry emergency numbers and contacts with you:
 - local police
 - study abroad or residential coordinator in host country
 - parent/guardian/emergency contact at home
 - Emory police and CIPA contact information
 - Embassy in host country
 - Insurance contact information
 - physician and mental health practitioner at home
3. Know where the local hospitals are located and how to get there.
4. By preparing yourself to respond to different types of emergencies you will feel more confident that you know what to do in the rare event that an emergency should occur:
 - natural disaster
 - medical / mental health injury or trauma
 - civil unrest / terrorism
 - criminal violence or trauma
